Supervisor Dezan then opened the floor to old business

- Jason stated that EMS is up to 90 calls.
- We had to make an adjustment to the budget for the Insurance for the ambulance service.
- EMS will be here next month to give us a quarterly report. They had requested that we buy new shirts that state Morrisonville-Ellenburg Ambulance so there is no confusion.
- The Ellenburg Depot Fire Department has stated they may not continue with their EMS due to their ambulance getting outdated. So we will be able to revisit that at a future date.
- Jason stated that the mausoleum looks great and the guys down there are working on getting the roof done for the chimney. They did 35 cremations last month. The trees being cut has opened that area up and it looks really nice.
- The Salt shed is being built now. The bond is here and we are ready to make payments as soon as they are required.

Neil stated that we cannot get grant money this year or next year for the generator that we have been talking about. Neil has researched and knows that we have some

heaters that are not working at the Town highway garage. If we were to purchase the generator and the two heaters (all propane) it would cost right around \$13,000. Jason stated it is not in the budget, but we do have money in savings that we could transfer over to the general fund for this. (\$11,443 for materials) We would have to do the work.

Supervisor Dezan called for the town clerk's report. Bethany Fortin stated that business is functioning as usual. If you know someone who is going to officiate a wedding in NYS, they need to pay for their officiant license at the same location that the couple getting married got their marriage license from.

Supervisor Dezan asked if the Highway Superintendent had anything to report, Bradley was absent this meeting. The highway department just got done paving the Bull Run Road.

Supervisor Dezan then asked for the code officer's report. Adam Trombley was absent this meeting.

Supervisor Dezan then called for the Historian's report, Joan Hobbs reported that she would like to thank Debbie, Adam, Brad, Jeremy, Doreen and Danny for helping put out the Hometown Hero banners up. She also put flags up in the cemeteries. The girl scouts went in and put some up and Joan went and did some more because some of the plaques are unreadable. The town wide garage sale is this weekend also! Next year there will be another round of these flags to be purchased.

Supervisor Dezan stated that the Youth report was that baseball and softball is going on. Swimming program is coming up.

Folks are reserving the pavilion and the town hall for meetings and everyone is reminded to contact Bethany Fortin to reserve a time slot or date if they would like it. The next item on the agenda were council member reports:

Deryl Gregory – Deryl Gregory reported the following:

- Deryl reported that he and Debbie went to the meeting for wind. Marie Agan stated that on the 27<sup>th</sup> there will be a breakfast and a lunch available during the meeting times. The meetings are 8-11 and the evening is 4-7. It will be informational for everyone to come and see what the updates are. There is a supervisors meeting at 7:30 on Tuesday evening. Right now it sounds like if everything goes well that construction will start at the end of 2024.
- Deryl also stated that AES is getting their used blades from Kansas and before they can refurbish the current windmills, we are waiting for a few state agencies that give the go ahead.
- The blood drive was this evening and they had 10 or 12 people.
